
The National Gallery of Slovenia, with its hundred years of tradition, is the main Slovenian cultural institution for classical art and a treasure chest of Slovenian fine arts. Woman Drinking Coffee, Summer, Before the Hunt, The Larch, and The Sower are some of the favourite works of art from the Permanent Collection, which showcases more than 600 works from the Middle Ages to the end of the 20th century.

The new Permanent Collection was inaugurated in January 2016, when the renovated Gallery premises were opened. The three-year renovation finally integrated the three wings of the gallery complex – the glass Entrance Hall, the New Wing, and the Narodni dom Palace, the oldest part of the Gallery.

Since 1896, the Narodni dom Palace has been a monument to Slovenian culture in Ljubljana. It was called the lighthouse of Slovenian spirit and hosted numerous cultural and societal events. We wish to carry on with tradition, since the representative halls offer a perfect backdrop for various occasions. Throughout its history, the Gallery has welcomed presidents, honoured academicians and authors, hosted musical performances, banquets and formal events.

The Grand Hall, the Golden Hall, and the Entrance Hall are synonymous with the most elegant halls in Slovenia, while the outstanding works of art remain silent witnesses of social events and their stories. They are ready to witness your story, too.






A bright and minimalist vaulted hall on the lower ground floor is suitable for minor receptions. Standing reception 80







